The theme for today is "Give me a break!"

That's how you and I would feel if we sat down with Jesus and asked him what we need to do to inherit eternal life. And then got this response: "You lack one thing; go, sell what you have, and give money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

Now, some of us might be willing to do what Jesus is asking. But it's a very high bar, isn't it? Most of us, if not all, would find that condition, that requirement, that expectation, beyond our means or beyond our wishes or both. We simply are not going to <u>sell all</u> that we have and then <u>give all</u> to the poor. We don't want to do it. Because there are already too many people who rely on my assets. And I also have needs. I don't want to sell all that I have.

In short, "Give me a break!"

This is a really interesting phrase. It has two ingredients. "Give me" and "a break." Verb and noun. What's missing here? That's right. "Please" is missing.

"Please give." That's a much better approach to the Lord. The Lord doesn't have to give us anything. The Lord could ignore our request. But the Lord chooses to give us, whether we say "please" or not. That's the Lord's Nature. A Nature which, frankly, we rely on. We would be in an even bigger mess without this Loving Nature.

Yes, we're in enough of a mess, even with God's Loving nature. But God is used to this behavior, this shortfall, this "give me break" language. God gave us freedom, so God shouldn't be surprised that we might misuse the freedom or take it for granted. What God is hoping for is that we won't take His Love for granted, but rather that we will give thanks by sharing that Love.

For you and me, "Yet another chance" is our biggest prayer. And, in Jesus, that prayer has been answered. "Dear Lord, we know what we ought to do, but sometimes we fail to do it. We're a little casual about our relationship with You." Sometimes more than casual. Yes, sometimes we just assume Your love. And, yes, sometimes you remind us in a variety of ways, that rather than <u>assuming</u>, we should show our appreciation by <u>helping</u> others.

First Reading: Wisdom of Solomon 1:16-2:1, 12-22

The ungodly by their words and deeds summoned death; considering him a friend, they pined way and made a covenant with him, because they are fit to belong to his company. For they reasoned unsoundly, saying to themselves, "Short and sorrowful is our life, and there is no remedy when a life comes to its end, and no one has been known to return from Hades. Let us lie in wait for the righteous man, because he is inconvenient to us and opposes our actions; he reproaches us for sins against the law, and accuses us of sins against our training. He professes to have knowledge of God, and calls himself a child of the Lord. He became to us a reproof our thoughts; the very sight of him is a burden to us, because his manner of life is unlike that of others, and his ways are strange. We are considered by him as something base, and he avoids our ways as unclean; he calls the last end of the righteous happy, and boasts that God is his father. Let us see if his words are true, and let us test what will happen at the end of his life; for if the righteous man is God's child, he will help him, and will deliver him from the hand of his adversaries. Let us test him with insult and torture so that we may find out how gentle he is, and make trial of his forbearance. Let us condemn him to a shameful death for, according to what says, he will be protected." Thus they reasoned, but they were led astray, for their wickedness blinded them, and they did not know the secret purposes of God, nor hoped for the wages of holiness, nor discerned the prize for blameless souls.

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes, and say, "Have seat here, please," while to the one who is poor you say, "Stand there," or, "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. For the one who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the Law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgment will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment. What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.
